The school, located near Jackson, was established 45 years ago for orphaned and physically handicapped Negro children. Through the farm, operated by the boys and the domestic science program for girls, the school contributes a great deal to its own support.

A spokesman for Mrs. Wilkinson said that, since a splendid program of household work is maintained for girls, clothing is altered or made over there to fit the needs of the children.
