Maple Harriers Hosts To Regional Tourney

Birmingham high school will play host this Saturday to the annual county regional with Pontiac as the chief contender for this year's class A crown. There will be ten class A and 12 class B teams with Class B starting at 11 a.m.
Led by Captain Bill Douglas, the Maple Harriers won the Saginaw Valley championship last week. Under Coach Wally Schloerke, this marks the team's thirty-second victory in a period of five and one-half years. Pontiac's first five includes besides Douglas, Perry Williams, Morris Jackson, Rodney Treanin, and Eugene Certal, of whom three are juniors and two side novices.
Royal Oak's five under Coach Don Bray includes Clarence Harrah, Jerry Steinar, Don Oler, and Ron Jones as co-captains, and Jim Eriertsen. Although some of their top men graduated last year, Royal Oak maintains a season record of six wins and two losses and is expected to place well up among the leaders.

Also in THE spotlight this year is Birmingham's squad with a season record of five wins and two losses. Led by co-captains Dave Long and Jim Tapp, the other members of the first five are Ed Stenle, Bob Libby, and Bob Brown.
Other class "A" teams include Hamtramck, Waterford, Port Huron, Southfield, and Detroit Catholic Central.
A strong Walled Lake team might prove to be this year's winner of the class "B" title. Their three linemen are Don Pounds, Don Avery, and Jim Bailey. The Walled Lake harriers placed second in last year's regional run.

Another STRONG contender in class "B" is Farmington. The remaining "B" teams are Auburn Heights, Troy, Cass City, Milford, St. Clair Lincoln high in Van Dyke, Crosswell, Clarendonville high in Livonia, Redford Union and Centerline.
This presents the final listing for Saturday's running although there are still chances of possible additions or scratches.
Officials, under the direction of Mr. Frank Whitney, will include: Mr. H. Keller, Mr. H. Sumner, Mr. R. Langerman, Mr. D. Lutkas, and Mr. E. Gerbar, together with the members of Birmingham's physical education department.
Members of Birmingham high school's journalism classes are to act as course inspectors, spotters, scorers, and recorders.
