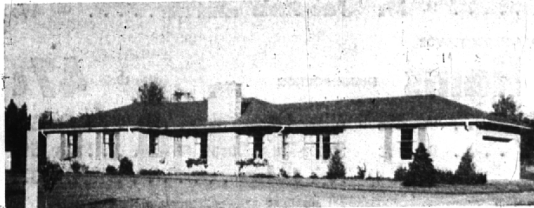

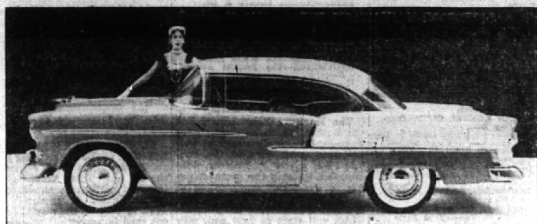

Maples Ready For Big Reds

Seeking their third straight league triumph, the Birmingham football team invades Port Huron tomorrow night to engage the perennially powerful Big Red in an important game for both teams. Port Huron, which has won the E.M.I. championship three years running, leads the League with a 2-1 record, while Birmingham is in second spot, owning a 2-2 mark. The Maples will also have the added incentive of not having lost the Hurons since 1949, last year's contest going to Port Huron 34-7. So far this season the Big Red has rolled up a total of 97 points while holding opponents to 27 in compiling an overall record of four wins, one lost and one tied. The Hurons have taken decisions from Highland Park 20-0, Lansing Eastern 20-2, Mt. Clemens 32-12 and last week Ferndale 13-7. The loss came at the hands of East Detroit 6-0 and the tie in the opening game with Hay City Handy 6-6.

PORT HURON coach Bob Hayes has molded his T-formation offense around co-captain and quarterback Lyle McAuley, a smooth ball handler and fine passer. Also instrumental in the Hurons' attack is 190 pound fullback Dick Turner, a line smasher with fine speed who plays end on defense. Spearheading the line is the other co-captain, tackle Lou Masters, who Hayes says is one of the best linemen he has ever coached. Veteran guard Jerry Spadafora and ends Roger Hanton and Doug McEachin are also outstanding.

Birmingham gave its best performance of the current campaign before a home crowd last week, downing East Detroit 12-6. Coach Carl Lemie was pleased with the victory, which brought the season's record to four wins against two setbacks.

Birmingham is in good physical condition after last Friday's game, and with the exception of Jim Johnson and Dave Allen who are sidelined for the rest of the season, all the Maples will be ready to go tomorrow night and to accept the opportunity that both the coaches and players have been pointing for all year.

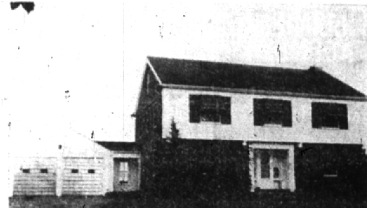

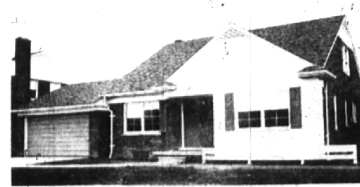
