Nov. 15 Deadline For Yule Packages Going Overseas

October 15 to November 15 again has been designated by the Birmingham post office as the preferred period for sending Christmas parcels abroad to members of the armed forces.

Because of the great distances involved, boxes should be of strong construction. Wood, metal or double faced corrugated fibre-board of 25-pound test are recommended.

ADDRESSES should contain the full name, grade, service number, organization and APO number. Air parcel post packages may be shipped until Nov. 25 and are limited to 30 inches in length and weight combined and weight not over two pounds.
