Tomorrow the "Three Little Pigs" show goes into its third performance before the youngsters at the Pontiac Area Day Nursery.

Mrs. Robert Doyle, 1076 Pierce, heads production for the marionette play written for the four-to-eight year-olds. It utilizes a special small stage designed by the group for use in hospital rooms, homes and kindergartens.
