she had a most terrifying experience in Hurricane Carol which she has no desire to repeat.

According to Mrs. Brewer, on August 30 the harbor at Point Judith was filled with boats that had come to participate in the annual Tuna Derby. During the day winds started to rise but there was no warning of a bad storm.

The next day when it was obvious that a storm of unusual ferocity was about to hit they felt they must get to a safer region.

One way the road was completely washed out and the only remaining route was by means of a causeway over which the waves were already washing.

Mrs. Brewer, her brother-in-law and sister, Mr. and Mrs. Leslie Thompson and her 37 year-old father, Alan MacQuarrie, took this perilous route in the family car to the highest point on Great Island, feeling almost as though the waves would wash the car into the sea at any minute.

After Hurricane Carol had passed, according to Mrs. Brewer, the winds and sea had calmed sufficiently, the Thompsons, Mrs.

Brewer and the father went back to Point Judith.

There they viewed the formerly powerful beach with the Tuna boats lining the harbor. Now it was cluttered with battered boats and debris of wrecked homes.

The family was without water or lights for two days and their food was supplied by the Coast Guard.

Mr. Brewer, at home and very concerned about the safety of his wife, could not reach the Thompsons or learn their fate for two days. He then flew to Green Wood, R. I., and he and Mrs. Brewer returned home together.

Mrs. Brewer said that Birmingham and home certainly looked good to her on her return.

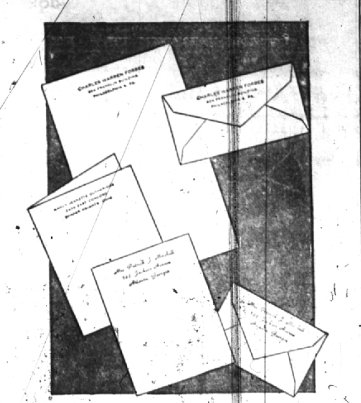

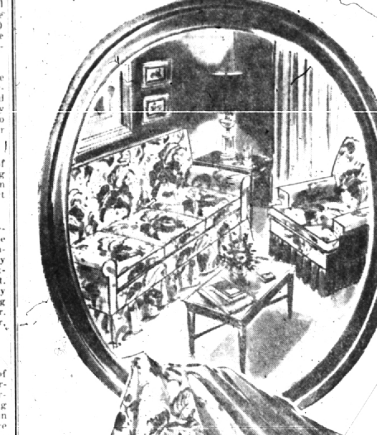
