Mrs. Elmer Shaver will lead devotions and the program will be a film "The Warning Shadow" by the Cancer society.

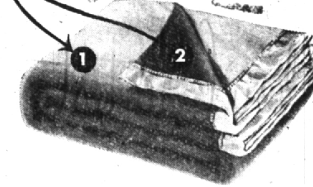
