

County GOP Leaders Map Campaign Plans

Forty Republican leaders of Oakland County met last week in the office of Edward E. Wilson, county chairman, to plan their strategy for the final weeks of the 1954 campaign. John Feikens, Republican state chairman, addressed the meeting to describe the intensified campaign activities of gubernatorial candidate Donald S. Leonard and U. S. Senator Homer Ferguson.

"Oakland is one of the key counties that will determine the outcome of this crucial Michigan election," Feikens declared. "Never before in Oakland County history— not even in 1892—has it been so vitally important for Republican workers to work and republican voters to vote!"

Congressman George A. Dondero, running for reelection from the 18th congressional district, warned, "The 1954 election can well be a showdown between Republican-Americanism and Democratic socialism in the tremendously strategic field of peacetime atomic power. To preserve our inherited form of free government, we must get out and vote."
