Members of W. Bloomfield LWV Begin Finance Drive

During the next few weeks, members of the West Bloomfield League of Women Voters will be going into high gear on their annual finance drive.

The "kick-off" meeting was held at the home of the president, Mrs. Jack Cotgens, of Orchard Lake road, on Tuesday, September 28.

At this time finance chairman, Mrs. Campbell Harvey, instructed members on procedure for the drive. On Mrs. Harvey's committee are Mrs. R. C. Banker, Mrs. Clare Heilenberg and Mrs. James Sainborn, Sr.

The goal this year is \$750, which will be used throughout the year to print and distribute league literature to voters, such as the highly respected Voter's Guide which is based on pertinent government questions submitted to all candidates running for public office.

Over 300 copies of "This is West Bloomfield," a township survey prepared by the league, have been sent out to friends and contributors along with a letter explaining league activities.

On Tuesday morning, October 12, Mrs. Banker will enter the township hall on Orchard Lake road, and work at a breakfast, after which all areas in the township will be solicited for funds.

At the end of the day, the members will meet again at Mrs. Banker's home for tea. Follow-up calls will be cleaned up within two weeks.
