AN EVENT OF unusual interest drew many visitors to the greenhouses at Cranbrook two evenings last week when a night blooming orchid cactus—sometimes called the "cercus"—sent forth more than 100 of its beautiful, fragrant white blooms, Dr. Marion Hall (left), Cranbrook botanist, confers with Alger Munt, Cranbrook institute for 17 years, said there were about 50 blooms on the several plants. Tuesday and Wednesday evenings. Immediately to the left of Dr. Hall's head hang some of the dying blossons which reached the peak of their beauty the night before. Blooms come from the sides and ends of the leaves, taking only a short time from the appearance of the bud to the full flower which lasts only one night. These particular plants are about 12 years old, Munt explained, adding that a plant rarely blooms during its first seven years.
