YMCA Craft Shop Near Completion

Using funds derived from the sale of Christmas trees, the Birmingham Y's Men's Club, under the direction of Project Chairman Ernest Robinson, are putting the finishing touches to the craft shop just to the rear of the YMCA building.

The shop contains equipment and benches to take care of 13 boys and 1 leader for each 45-minute period. Small things such as bird houses, clothes line racks, toys, book shelves and hook ends will be made in the shop. A regular schedule of available times and instructions will be made available after October 1.

A YMCA bus which was a summer project and gift of the Birmingham Y's Men's Club to the city will be used for transporting boys and girls to camp for overnight outings. It is the intention of the program committee to operate the bus as long as the weather permits and the roads are safe for travel.

New Cub Pack B-31 To Hold Induction

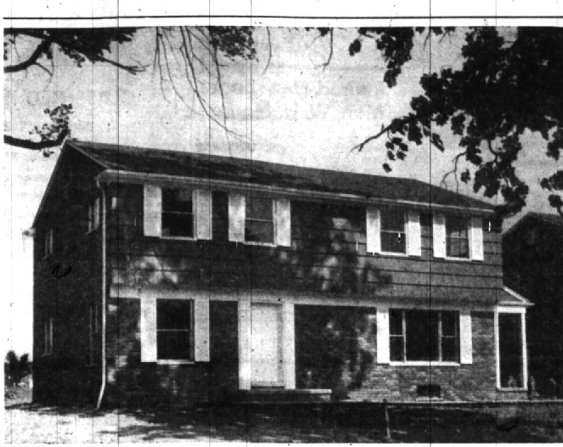
