Incinerator Fires Expected To Start About October 15

Birmingham garbage and rubbish will soon find its end in the South Oakland County Garbage and Rubbish Authority's huge incinerator in Royal Oak township. City Manager Donald C. Egbert learned this week that the first fire in the furnace would be started about October 15 with trial operations at the plant to be continued until mid-November when full-scale incineration is expected to begin.

Opening of the incinerator for full use by the authority's 12-member communities will mean the close of land-fill dumping operations at the city's dump on east Maple road.

REQUEST of the authority for extension of the use of the Birmingham dump until Dec. 1 was approved this week by the city commission. Egbert commented that the land fill was nearly completed but added that plans for the property's future use, now that it has been reclaimed, would await development of adjacent Troy township property.

Permanent staff members will assist reserve members with their pronunciation and diction, enabling them to get on the permanent staff.

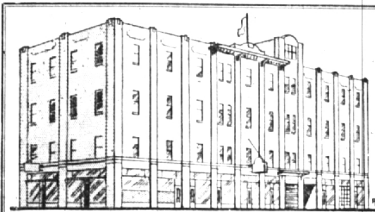
