Gun Club Dates

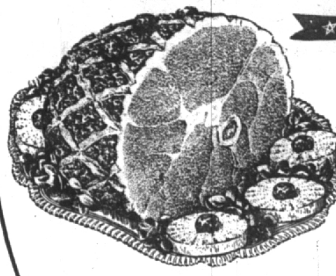
