

Helpful Lawn Hints From MSC Expert

It is hard to beat touring the streets of our town when you need an inspiration for beautifying your home grounds. The other morning at 2113 Yorkshire I saw a lead grey tri-level home down so well that many motorists slow down to see the effect of white petunias, the grey house and its stark-white trim.

As the house faces south, shrub selections have white flowers. Nanking cherry looks like a shrub that comes into flower very early with a great mass of white blooms. A white flowering dogwood would give a good accent. Deutzias don't grow very high and give a good mass effect of white flowers, about five plants in "a huddle" would be good. The sergeant crab assures the user of a good show of white flowers. It is a shrub which grows about eight feet high and eight feet across. A grouping of three double smock oranges would give a good June show of white. The white Edith Cavell lilac gives a wonderful effect, in full sun, with huge panicles of white flowers.

HOUSE HUNTING took me to 2447 Manchester where the landscaping is done in very good taste. The lawn is well kept and the texture of the shrubs is good in front of this dark red brick home with its brown trim.

There is a priceless evergreen on the front lawn and the total effect is restful, not "busy." This is due to good spacing and the texture of the plant material.

At 812 Kenmore there is a large white stucco home and on each side of the doorway are huge mature magnolias which provide the needed vertical line often delegated to overgrown evergreens.

Recently I was at Michigan State college to hear Dr. James Tyson talk about lawn grass experiments.

They have been plagued with insects about as much as the rest of the area as a result of a plug from Arthur Godfrey who thought it was the answer to all lawn problems.

It likes high humidity and hot weather and by test recently good as far north as Cincinnati.

DR. TYSON couldn't say enough for Tyson grass experiments and called it the "best grass of the time." It has a horizontal growth and not too fast on the vertical progress. It likes a sunny location and a good soil. He suggests cutting it at one and a half inches for best results.

If your lawn has part shade Dr. Tyson recommends planting 20 per cent red fescue with it for best results.
