The first big step for the churchs came in June when, for the first time in the church's history, it was assigned a full-time pastor, the Rev. Robert P. Ward.

Mr. Ward, a graduate of Duke university and the Yale divinity school, was associate minister of Westlawn Methodist church in Detroit for two years.

METHODIST activities started in Troy township in 1827, when Elder Warren organized a religious class, with meetings in a log schoolhouse located a mile and a half from the present Troy village.

The church auditorium was erected 10 years later on property deeded to the group by Johnson Niles, Troy's first settler. He received the land on a government grant in 1822. The building was purchased by the Methodists in 1862 and has been used by them since that time.
