## Wing Lake's Two Beach Projects In Full Swing for Next Summer

Wing Lake, Farm residents are looking forward to next summer when their beach area will be finished and ready for their enjoyment. Merle Sullivan, chairman of the beach committee, reports that contractor, Arden Mitchell, started work shortly after Labor Day.

By means of hydraulic dredging, the weeds and mud in the shallow water area are being pumped onto the dry ground. This will be leveled for a parking lot at the rear of the beach. More sand will then be spread on the beach for sunbathers and, in shallow water, for swimmers entering the lake.

After several months of hard work on behalf of the Wing Lake Property Association in connection with the beach project, and his committee, Burton Aikens, Glen James and Randall Crabb, report that copies of the plans and specifications submitted by Richard Kleener for the improvement of the beach and parking area are now in the hands of contractors. Richard Kleener was the engineer in charge of the development of the Metropolitan Beach area in St. Clair.

Contracting bids for the work should be in the hands of the beach committee this week. Soon thereafter, Bill Fraser, head of the finance committee, and his co-workers will call upon Wing Lake Property Association members to solicit the necessary funds to carry the beach plans through to completion.

## Police Chief Relates Juvenile Problems to PTA

Chief Ralph Moxley of the Birmingham Police department will be guest speaker at the first fall meeting of the Baldwin PTA on Sept. 28. "Are We Losing the Battle Against Juvenile Delinquency?" will be his topic for discussion at 8 p.m.

Chief Moxley will draw upon his experience with juvenile delinquency in Birmingham and his knowledge of its problems elsewhere to point out mistakes parents make dealing with delinquents, danger signals to watch for, signs of coming delinquency which appear in early grades and even in the preschool child.

The film "Angry Boy" will be shown by Chief Moxley in connection with his talk. This film, part of the Emotions of Everyday Living Series, shows the story of a boy who stole money and how a guidance clinic helped the boy and

his parents straighten out their emotional and psychological problems.

Chief Moxley has agreed to answer questions from the floor. "The World Around Your Child" is the theme for this year's series of Baldwin PTA meetings. The entire program will be announced at a short business meeting which will precede Chief Moxley's talk. Entry tickets will be given out for a contest which will be explained at the meeting. Refreshments will be served.

Other programs for the year, according to PTA president, Mrs. Patricia V. Lyndall, will dwell on emotional problems of children, sex education in the home, effective teaching and health safeguards for children.
