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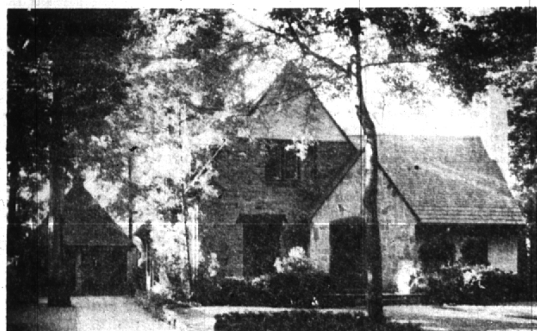


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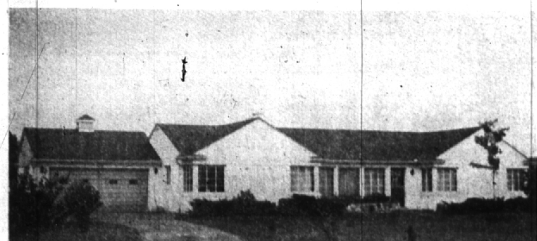

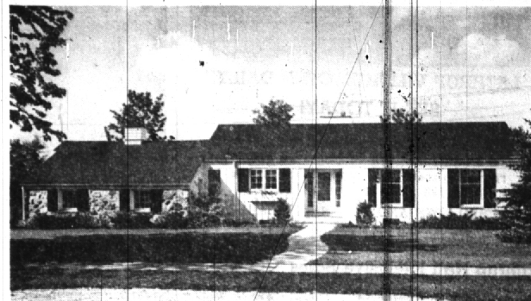
Seven sophomores on the squad are getting their first experience in debating this year.

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
