Soloist, Betty Ann Brietling, of Southfield, a friend of the bride and groom, sang "Because" and "The Lord's Prayer."

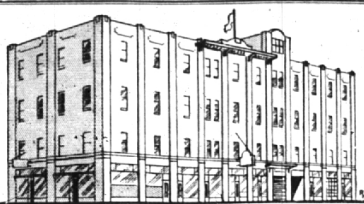

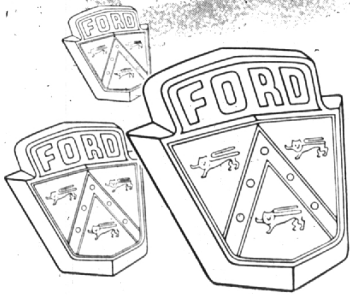
