## B'ham Maples Trampled Cranes Friday '21 to '12

B'HAM HIGH—Dedicating its sparkling new field last Friday evening, Birmingham turned loose a powerful offensive effort racing past an eager Cranbrook eleven 21-12 for the second win in as many starts.

However, both squads lost, he-4 game when his arm was broken. He, too, was removed from the field in an ambulance but was on his feet by Sunday.

The Maples got a good look at their modern scoreboard, a gift of the American Legion, but not until they had been scored upon after a sustained opening power drive of 26 yards by the Cranbrook 14, Cranbrook 12.

On the initial play of the fourth stanza right halfback John Appleford swept his end and galloped 40 yards for the contest's final touchdown. Watkinson made it three for three with his conversion.

A bad pass from center eliminated hopes of the extra point and the score, second Cranbrook 6, Maples 0.

On the following kickoff, Allen received the ball on the 15 yard line on the west side of the gridiron, faked a handoff, saw a hole, and scampered 82 yards up the sidelines without a hand being laid on him to knot the score at 6-11. Captain Bill Watkinson hosted the conversion to put Birmingham ahead for the first time 7-0. Allen was hurt just seven plays later.

THE MAPLES LENGTHENED the difference when center Bob Hohmeyer fell on a faulty Crane pikeout on the visitors' nine yard line. On third down fullback Wayne Gregg hustled straight ahead for four yards and the touchdown. Watkinson, once more converted to hand Birmingham a 14-6 half-time margin.

Cranbrook came back powerfully in the opening minutes of the last half to come within two points of closing the margin. After a punt return, the Cranes marched 28

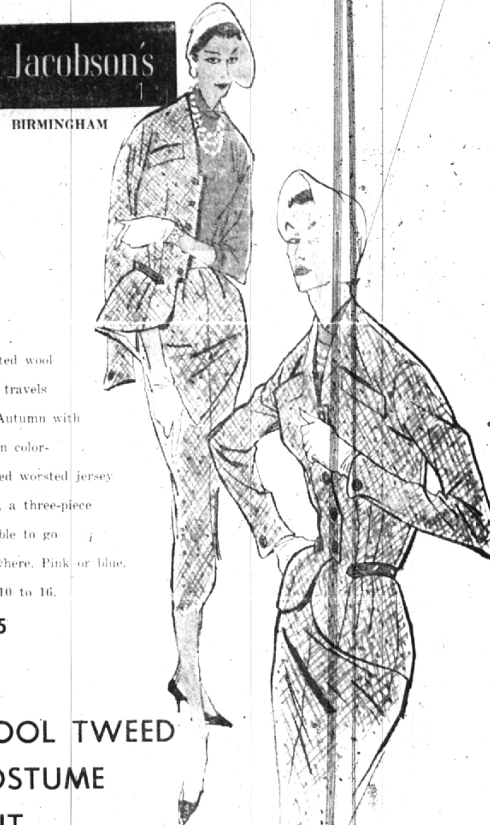

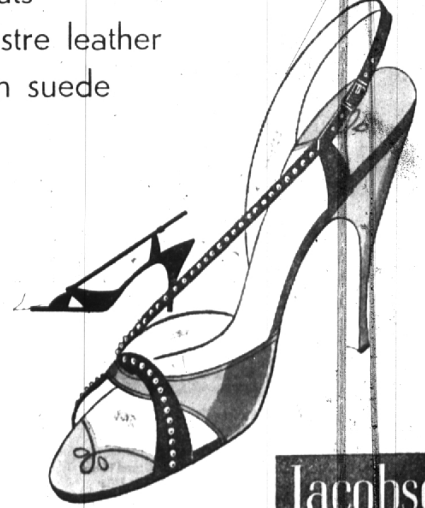
