Mrs. Waterman said the night before the storm struck, the cottage shows from the force of the wind. Radio messages kept repeating there was no immediate danger and that ample warning would be given should the situation grow worse. However, no further warning was benedesat.

AFTER THE WORST of the storm had passed, they began the rough trip back to the shore, arriving there about 1 p.m. to find the cottage gone. "It had been moved some distance," Mrs. Waterman said, "but other than everything being soaked, was not badly damaged. A lamp on a table had not been tipped over. The cottage next to ours was almost completely demolished.

"When we entered, we found looters already had been there. A clock of mine and my husband's watch were stolen. While we were getting the rest of our things out, National Guardsmen came and questioned us. We had to convince them we were legally on the property."

The Watermans were able to look across the area and see miles of destruction. Cars, dwellings, boats and trees all had fallen victims of the storm.



FLUCTUATION OF REPUBLICAN VOTES AT TOP Ups and downs of Democratic ratios at botton




CHART RECORDS RECENT CHANGES
