

U of M Schedules Series of Lectures On Old-Age Problem

"Living in the Later Years," a lecture-discussion series for adults who wish to achieve a useful and pleasant old age will be offered by the University of Michigan, beginning Oct. 4, 7:30 p.m. at Pontiac high school.

Scheduled to run for six weeks, the first meeting of the series will be devoted to an introduction of the problem. The following dates and topics announced are, "Good Health: The Challenge of Aging," Oct. 11; "Psychology of Aging," Oct. 18; "Living Arrangements," Oct. 25; "Economic Security in the Later Years," Nov. 1 and "Aging Creatively" on Nov. 8.

Speakers will include Dr. Wilna Donahue, chairman of the division of gerontology; Woodrow W. Hunter, research associate, division of gerontology; and J. Fred Russell, M.D., University of Michigan hospital.

The course is intended for older people; for those interested in planning for successful later years; for those who wish to evolve a harmonious family group that includes older people; and for those who have a professional interest in the problems of old age.

Registration is \$5.00 and enrollments will be taken at the opening session.
