

Tri-Level Homes Offered by Kuschell

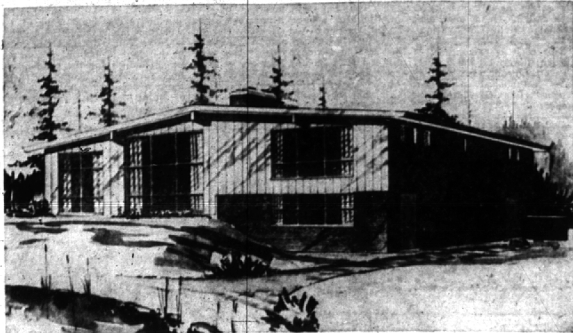
Green Bay subdivision, a 55-acre tract with shorelines on both Green and Flanders Lakes in West Bloomfield township, will be the focal point locally of a national observance of Hotpoint Appliances Company's Golden Anniversary, it was announced this week by Kuschell Realty Corp. of Bloomfield Hills, developers of the project.

Richard Kuschell said that two of five homes now being constructed at Green Bay are the Eastern and Southern models of the Hot Point Golden Anniversary Homes. First tri-level model in the subdivision will be opened to the public April 23. The homes are located one mile west of Hiller road on Willow road.

THE HOME'S lower level provides a workshop, heating plant, laundry area and a two-car garage. On the intermediate level are located the living area which has a glassed area facing the lake, an all-electric kitchen, a multi-purpose room, hobby room, TV room, study, library, and a dining room which connects with the living room by sliding doors.

The upper level contains three bedrooms and two baths, with closet and linen storage space. Verriette wood siding and brick make up the outer wall, with large areas of glass which look out over a terrace.

According to Kuschell, the homes, which are being constructed simultaneously in other areas of the United States, will be the subject of articles and advertising in national magazines. Four homes in the U.S., with kitchens furnished by Hotpoint, will be given away, Kuschell said.

Howard Johnson Restaurant Adds New Dining Wing

Howard Johnson Restaurant at 3310 N. Woodward, Royal Oak, is undergoing a \$41,400 expansion of their building which is expected to add seats for 50 more patrons, according to Edmund M. Boks, president of Central Continental Corp., which holds the local Howard Johnson franchise.

The 31x24-foot addition, which was begun March 15, is expected to be ready for use by May 15, according to Boks, who added that construction work is not interfering with service.

"WE FELT a need for expansion for two reasons," Boks said. "First, the rapid development of the area, and second, the additional commercial and office building type of construction which is space essential to eliminate any waiting period for customers."

Local Architects Chosen To Revamp Ypsilanti School

Swanson Associates, architects, of Bloomfield Hills, have been named by the State Board of Education to prepare a general development plan for the expected expansion of Michigan State Normal College at Ypsilanti.

Enrollment estimates as high as 10,000 have been projected for the college by 1970, and it is the judgment of the college officials and the state board that planning for this expansion will insure a well organized and beautiful campus.

ROBERT SWANSON, president of the firm, spoke to the general faculty of the college in a meeting on March 30. His talk was concerned with procedures and techniques that will be used in developing the plan.

Swanson Associates, who have produced overall development plans for other colleges and universities—one of the most recent being Louisiana State—will design the new science building requested in Governor G. Mennen Williams budget message, subject to legislative appropriation.

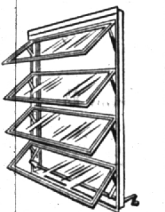

Annual Y Report Lists 2 Major Achievements

In the Annual Report for 1954 for the Detroit YMCA magazine, Edwin F. Kirbert, executive secretary of Birmingham's Y, pointed out that there were two significant happenings in the life of the local chapter last year.

First was the start of the Lincoln nursery school and second, the addition of a youth secretary to work with the younger Y members.

The nursery program operated each week day with an enrollment of 20 boys and girls under the direction of two trained supervisors. The youth department operated 72 different program activities for member groups within Birmingham and its environs, Kirbert said.

"INCLUDING the program for young people and adults," Kirbert said, "We had a total of 112 groups with enrollment regularly scheduled in 1954."

Kirbert went on the list participation figures, camp enrollments

and pointed out that the World Service committee raised \$533 for overseas work.

A 30-passenger bus was bought with profits from 1500 Christmas trees sold by the Y's Men's club, which also raised enough money to equip the craft shop with tools and sponsor 100 scholarship memberships for boys and girls.

KIRBERT concluded with a report on a Permanent Building committee. "A Permanent Building committee has been meeting and ascertaining the needs of our community which we hope to incorporate in a comprehensive building at some future date. A request for such a building has been filed with the Detroit YMCA Building committee."
