

NOT SATISFIED with this "first", he went on to become originator of the porcelain jacket crown for use in pairing broken or otherwise damaged teeth.

As his fame spread, other dentists sent patients to him from all over the state.

Dr. Spalding was born near Eagle Harbor at the extreme end of the Keweenaw Peninsula, where his father was a copper mine superintendent.

His early schooling was received there, and later at Sault Ste. Marie which became the family home. After completing high school there he attended the University of Michigan dental school and opened his office in Detroit after graduation in 1892.

SHORTLY AFTER opening his office here, he asked the school to send one of its brightest students to work in his office.

Following his theory that a person need not lose all his teeth after contracting pyorrhea, Dr. Spalding found himself without time to care for his practice properly.

The school sent Dr. Grace Rogers, woman pioneer in the field of dentistry. She later became Mrs. Spalding and continued her professional association with her husband's office until her death two years ago.

Specializing in periodontics, Mrs. Spalding became a noted

Specializing in periodontics, Mrs. Spalding became a noted authority on the disease and founded the Academy of Periodontology.

DR. SPALDING was president of the MSDA 1907-08 and the Academy of Periodontology in 1937. He is a fellow of the American College of Dentists. Although his practice is now limited, Dr. Spalding is still active in the field.

"Dentistry is not an art, any more, but a science. I must keep studying constantly to keep up with it," he remarked.
