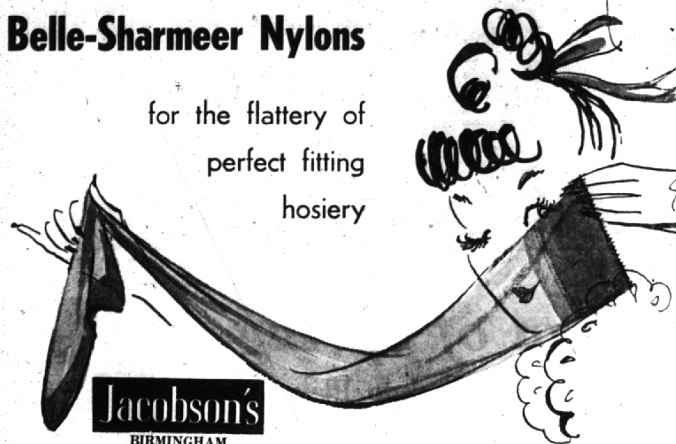
Mrs. J. D. Stanton of West Surrey have been vacationing at Indian Rocks beach in Florida, with last weekend concluding their stay.
