

Dave Barton Gives Views on Turnpike

To the Editor: At present I am commuting over 65 miles each day and am acutely aware of our traffic problems. By the road map my best route would be Telegraph highway and the Willow Run expressway.

It is disheartening to travel as fast as Telegraph allows between stop lights and speed limit zones then cruise along the expressway about 70 miles per hour only to discover my average velocity has turned out to be 30 miles per hour.

Interestingly enough I have discovered that by following several proposed roads at an average of 40 MPH, I can average the same speed and to work from that obtained via Telegraph.

SEVERAL things have contributed to the plight of our Telegraph highway. There are too many stop lights. The speed limit zones through such places as Dearborn cause a bottleneck. The influx of every business imaginable causes accidents and congestion along the road.

Left turns at intersections cut down the effectiveness of the road by 50 per cent. To add insult to injury it is hard to imagine who in their right mind would permit a light on a US highway which ties up public law-paying traffic up to 1/4 of a mile, bumper-to-bumper, while a few make left turns into a private drive in the rear.

ALL OF THE foregoing can be summed up as the tragic results of poor or no planning. If it weren't for the lack of planning, the present need for a turnpike through the few nice places left in this area would not exist at all.

I wonder what is to assure us that the same cycle won't be repeated time and time again? I cannot help but feel that any subversive groups interested in ruining all that is fine and trying to pull our level of living down to some sub-standard would be overjoyed to see the turnpike go through.

ALSO, concerning the cycle of permitting business and residents to converge on our highways until they demand lights and speed limits in effect strangle the road so a new one is needed, I wonder if the same thing will happen to Birmingham.

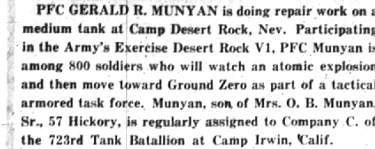
