

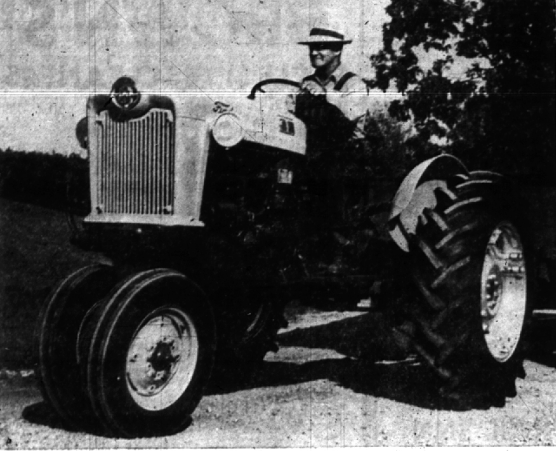

Three types of traffic violations have caused almost two-thirds of the city's auto accidents during the first three months of 1955, according to a report released recently by Police Chief Ralph W. Mosley.
 Of 132 accidents which occurred before April 1, 79 were a result of one of the following: violation of right-of-way, 30 accidents; following too closely, 31 accidents; improper passing, 18 collisions.

IF THE above violations had not been committed and the collisions averted, 12 people would not have been injured and over \$2,000 in property loss would not have resulted," Mosley said. "Careful attention of all enforcement officers to these three types of accidents should cut down the driving safely," Mosley said.

Tricycle Tractors Introduced

Ford Motor Company announced last week it has added three new tricycle farm tractors and companion front-mounted implements to its expanding line of farm machinery.
 They are the first tricycle models ever built by Ford, and are now in full production.
 Power-steered rear wheels are a major feature of the new tractors. In addition, the 300-pound tractors are built by hand to obtain the proper spacing for various field needs, the operator uses the tractor's own power to turn the wheel discs to obtain the desired spacing, in one-inch increments from 56 to 26 inches (from 64 to 24 inches with the discs reversed).

Stockholders Of Consumers Power to Meet

Residents of the Birmingham area who are share-owners in Consumers Power Company have been called to the annual regional stockholders meeting by David H. Gerhard, division manager of the company's southeast division.
 Gerhard said the meeting will be held April 21 at the Northland center auditorium at 7:45 p.m., at which time Robert P. Briggs, executive vice president, will talk briefly about the company's business and plans and discuss recent developments in the electric and gas industries.
 Briggs joined Consumers Power company in January, 1951 as vice president, with direct supervision over the company's corporate and treasury departments. In January, 1952, he was elected executive vice president by the board of directors and assumed supervision of the public relations department as well.
 Before joining Consumers, Briggs was for six years a vice president of the University of Michigan at Ann Arbor. He was in charge of business and finance activities of the university, including operation and expansion of the physical plant.
 The company is holding 10 such regional meetings in its outstate Michigan service area this month, Gerhard said.

THE TRACTORS and equipment are being made available first in those states where tricycle tractors are most commonly used.

Public showings by dealers throughout the nation are scheduled on a progressive basis through April and May.
 Front-mounted equipment designed for use with the new Ford tractors includes two and four-row cultivators with planter, fertilizer and side-dresser attachments. Other Ford implements, including a two-row mounted corn picker, will be available soon.
 Irving A. Duffy, Ford vice president and general manager, Tractor and Implement Division, pointed out, "The addition of the three tricycle tractors brings to eight the number of new Ford tractors announced since January of this year."

Big Boy Drive-in Opens on Woodward Near 13 1/2 Mile

Recently opened on the west side of Woodward near 13 1/2 Mile road was the Big Boy Drive-in, owned by brothers, Fred, John and Louis Elias.
 Parking space for 70 autos has been provided, with room for an additional 50 persons in the dining room.
 Two grills are in operation to provide faster service to customers.
 The drive-in has been scientifically designed so as to reduce to a minimum the number of steps required by the customer to get to the counter.
 Unique feature is the water tower, built to serve a year-around air conditioning system as well as to provide water necessary to the restaurant's operation.
