Before boarding the buses for a trip home, many visited the Olds hotel for coffee. Among these was Glep James who, acting as doorman for the crowd, somehow

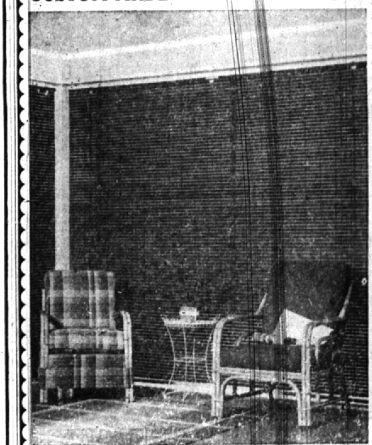
