

Cranes Use the Squeeze To End a One Run Famine

One run losses were starting to move out of the novelty class into the habit forming stage at Cranbrook until coach Fred Campbell's nine broke loose with an 8-4 win over Catholic Central Tuesday.

Against Flint Northern last weekend, the Cranes dropped their fourth loss of the season and like the other three games it was a single run 4-3 decision.

An entry fee of \$10 per team must be posted and the fee will be refunded if the season schedule has been completed. Entries are still being accepted at the Springdale course.
