

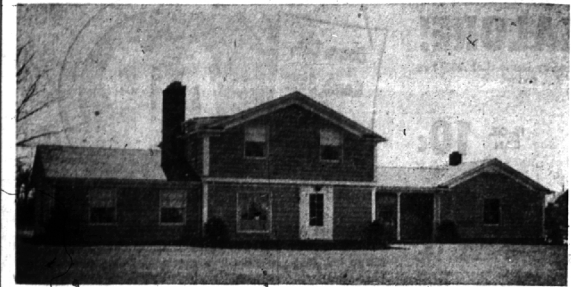
Junior Musicians Host Divisional Conference May 7

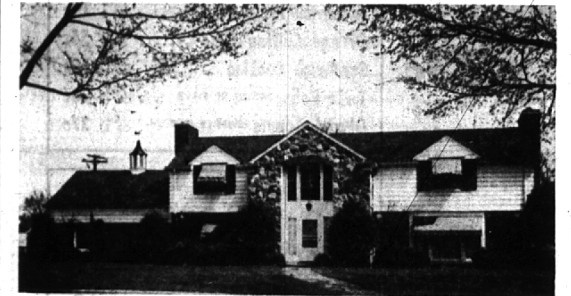

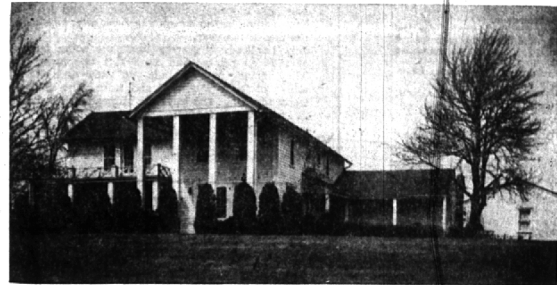
