## Art Hagman To Pick Site Of Girlstown

The site for the first Girlstown home sponsored by the Michigan Federation of Women's clubs will be recommended by Arthur A. Hagman, owner and publisher of Inside Michigan Magazine and a prime mover in the Girlstown project.

Hagman, whose home is at 3916 Cottonail lane, was a member of the panel discussion held on March 31 at the Michigan Federation of Women's Club convention when delegates were brought up to date on plans for Girlstown.

Hagman, who has the distinction of being the only honorary male member of the Michigan Federation of Women's clubs, was the first president of the original Girlstown Foundation before it was consolidated with the Women's club group.

The first funds for Girlstown were raised by the sale of subscriptions to Hagman's Inside Michigan.

As site chairman, Hagman will recommend Ann Arbor as a site for the first home because of the fact that University of Michigan psychiatric experts will be nearby for consultation with the home's superintendent on girls' behavior problems.

While Hagman labored at the convention session, from 7:30 a.m. until 6:00 p.m., it was moving day for his Inside Michigan office. When he returned to his office, empty desks greeted him for the staff and office records had been moved to a new location at 16506 James Couzens Highway.

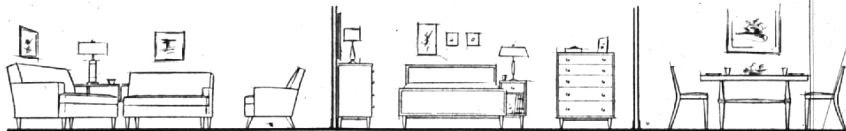
## Mrs. Collins Heads 65 in Y Delegation
