Olin Reed of Franklin road, who has been a sales representative for the Gravelly Tractor co., is

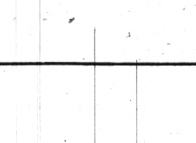
now under a contract as a dealer for the same organization.

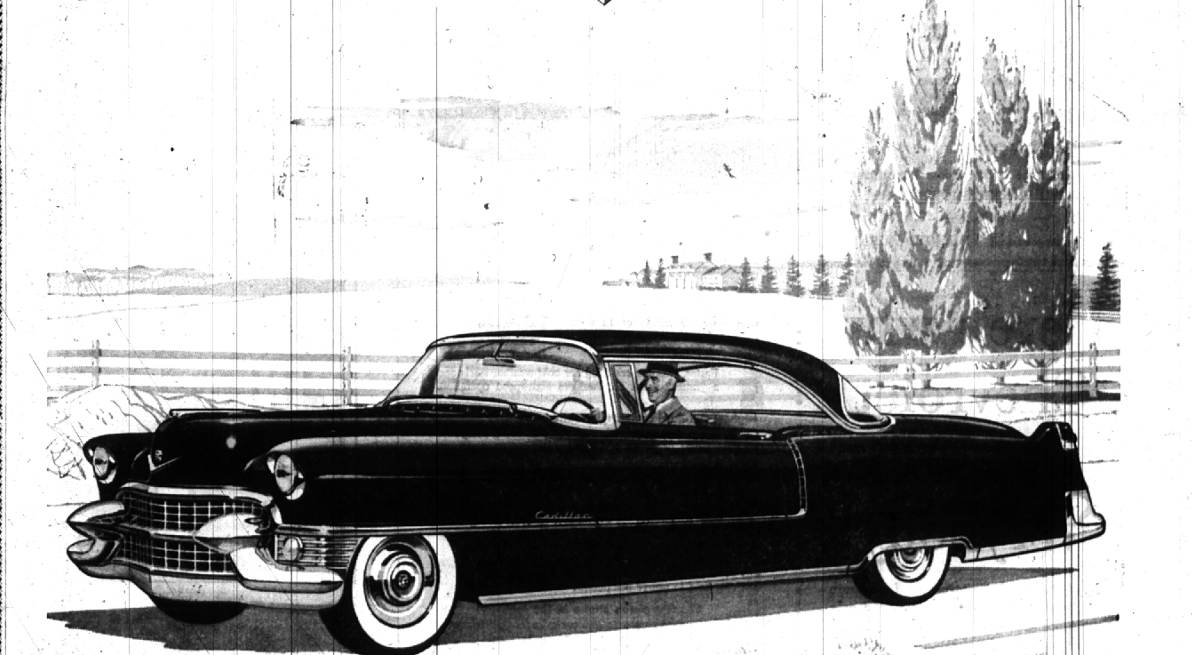
