

Honor Students Will Hear Top-Ranking English Educators

CRANBROOK — Young honor students from Detroit and the surrounding area will have an opportunity to hear two high-ranking English educators during a regional meeting of the Cum Laude Society on April 15 at Cranbrook School, Bloomfield Hills.

Professor Helen Lockwood, head of the English department at Vassar College, and Professor Arthur Jensen, head of the English department at Dartmouth College, will discuss "What To Expect in College."

Their audience will be composed largely of high school scholars and English instructors from Liggett, Kingwood School, Cranbrook, Cresson Pointe University School, Detroit Country Day School, Cranbrook School and Maumee Valley Country Day School.

ALL OF THESE independent schools, with the exception of Kingwood School, Cranbrook, are members of the national Cum Laude Society which corresponds to Phi Beta Kappa in colleges and universities.

The following day, April 16, the two professors will be panel guests during the School and College English Conference at Cranbrook School, which will be attended by English educators from the east coast, the south and central states area.

Will Start Nature Study Field Course

CRANBROOK — An eight-week field course in general nature study, open to the public, will begin at 7:30 p.m., Wednesday, April 6, in the auditorium of Cranbrook Institute of Science, Bloomfield Hills.

Sponsored by the Detroit Audubon Society, the course is offered for camp counselors, science teachers, leaders of youth groups, and parents who wish to bring children eight years old or over. Field study will include plants, insects, birds, minerals, rocks and fossils.

No Immediate Answer To Poor Roads Seen

People living on dirt or gravel roads in the Birmingham area will always get bogged down in mudholes during wet seasons as bad as the one just experienced, and about the only thing they can do is hope for (1) better weather in spring and fall or (2) hard surfaced all-weather roads.

While the repair and maintenance of all roads in Oakland county—except state highways or streets within city or village limits—is the responsibility of the Oakland County Road Commission, this agency is helpless to do much in the way of improving dirt and gravel roads in weather conditions like this year's, according to Leon Belkap, engineer with the commission.

THIS YEAR has been one of the worst in a long time, especially in the southern part of Oakland county, Belkap said, "and it points up the general problem facing residents here. Even if the Road commission's budget permitted us to work on every dirt road in the county, our own equipment

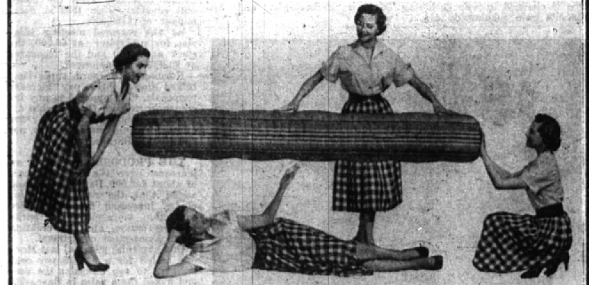
