Early Michigan Exhibit Told in U of M History

Three Michigan newspaper editors—named Blue Ink, Silk Paper and Quinquinn Quill—had a lot of fun on the job way back in 1846.
Actually the men with the fancy names were soldiers stationed at Fort Wilkins near Copper Harbor and their carefully penned manuscript, "The Agate," is part of the current exhibit on "Michigan's Northern Peninsula" at The University of Michigan's Historical Collections.
