Bender, president of R W Controller corporation, will be co-chairman with Charles Wright, of the industry section. He served as team solicitor for three of the four drives so far.

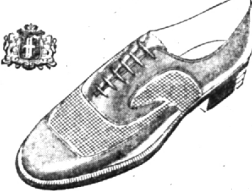
Wright, a resident of Royal Oak, is personnel director for Pontiac.

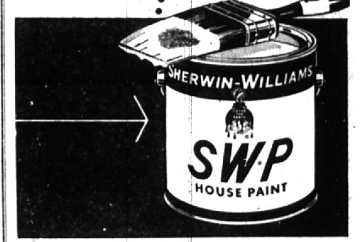

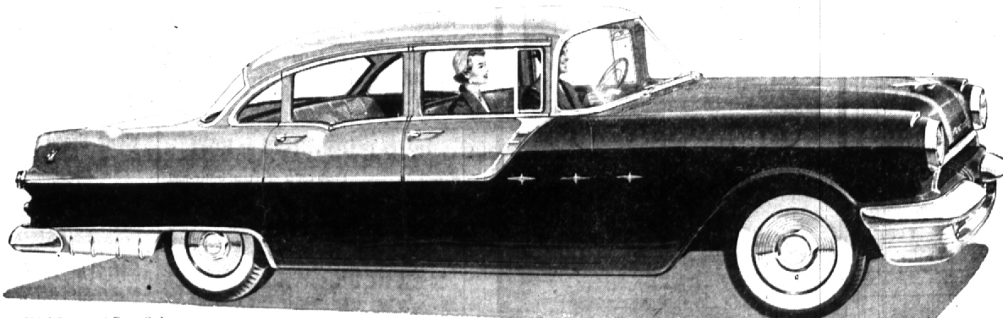
