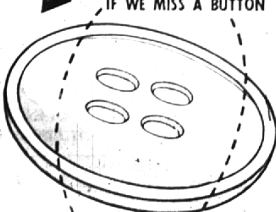

Mrs. Harry L. Crawford of a tea in Joan's honor was given by Mrs. John Denison of Bloomfield town and bathroom shower at her home.

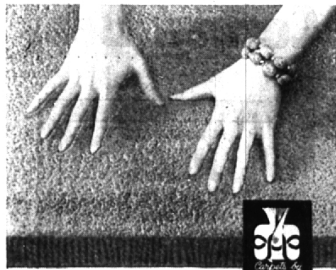

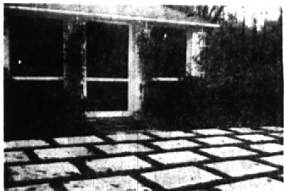
