## Holy Name Plans October Opening Date

With construction running well ahead of schedule, the Rev. Eugene Paddock this week said an Oct. 1 opening for the new Holy Name church was quite possible. Previous plans had set the opening for late December.

Construction on the new \$300,000 building began in May, the first phase of a two-step building program.

**THE BUILDING**, which will have a seating capacity of several hundred persons, occupies the site of the old church at Harmon and Woodland.
