 lodge.

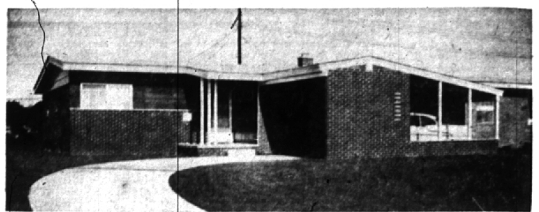

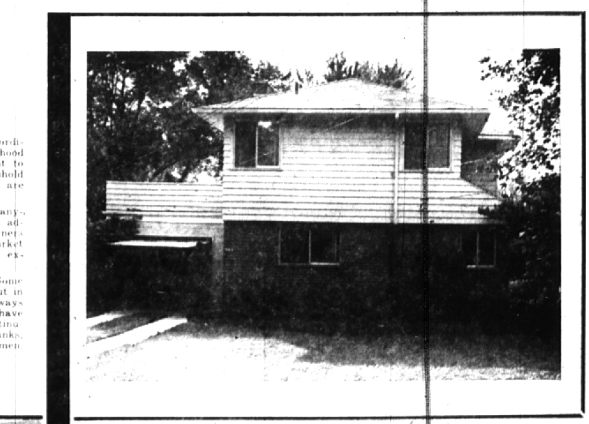
