Bloomfield Eyes Telegraph Threat To HS Students

Students crossing Telegraph at Long Lake road en route to Bloomfield Hills' new high school all ready are causing worry for parents and educators in the school district.

The Hills' board of education Tuesday night instructed Supt. Eugene L. Johnson to write proper authorities relative to greater regulation of traffic at the Telegraph-Long Lake intersection.

THE NEW SCHOOL, where students will be reporting on Sept. 5, is located on Long Lake just west of Telegraph, and the majority of students will be crossing at that corner.

"We're quite concerned and we're going to do all possible to make it safer for our youth," Johnson says, saying his efforts will be directed to the state and county highway commissions.

He indicated that the board, realizing the school's obligation to bring students safely across Telegraph, an important concern because of the number of accidents that happen on this major highway.

Report \$75 Worth Of Windows Broken
