Forest Lake Country club members are rummaging through their attics this week looking for something that will give them the south seas look.

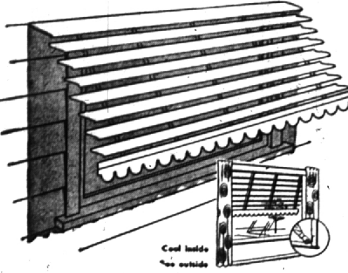
Last year's Hawaiian party was such a success that they are repeating the theme but changing the locale this year to Tahiti and planning for a big soiree on Saturday night.

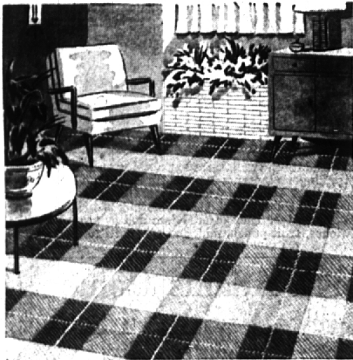

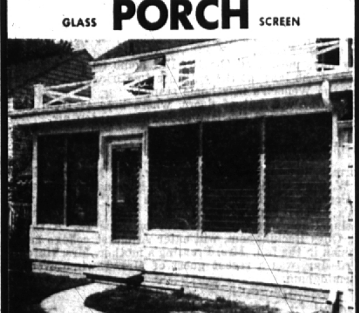
