VA Wants Korean Vets' Applications For Schooling Now

Michigan veterans who plan to start school this fall under the Korean GI Bill were urged this week by the Veterans Administration to apply for their papers before school terms begin.

By applying for their VA certificates prior to admission, veterans will help to prevent delay in the processing of their papers as it is predicted that a record-breaking number of veterans will begin schooling for the first time this fall.

VA's manager for Michigan pointed out that the need for applying for initial papers pertains only to those veterans who are starting training under the GI Bill programs for the first time.

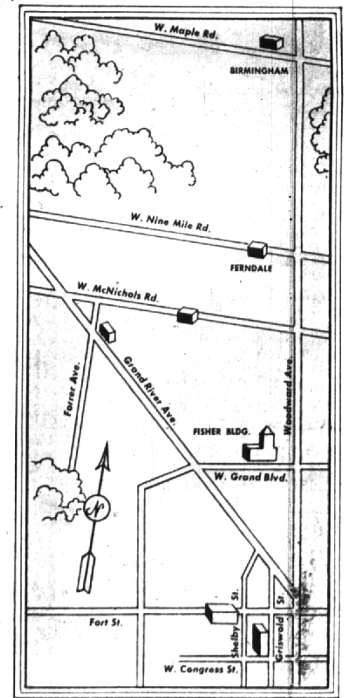
