Council Accepts Low Paving Bid

LATHRUP — Upon the okay from the Michigan Finance Commission, the city's 1955 paving projects can get underway.

The council Monday night accepted the low bid of \$54,170 made by Don Wells Inc. of 2608 North western, for 18 sections of paving in the city.

The same firm's bid of \$1,125 for private driveway paving in connection with the street paving, was also accepted. The private paving bid is only an estimate based on the probable number of homes following the stabilized aggregate base alteration of ditches, alteration of catch basins and manholes, removal of one tree, and bituminous aggregate surface.
