Garbage Authority Wants the Business Federal Officials Investigate Need For Lathrup P.O.

LATHRUP—The South Oakland County Garbage and Rubbish Authority is trying to push Lathrup into accepting its services under a contract made by Southfield township, which at the time included Lathrup.

The letter was referred to city attorney, Everett F. Hayes (who has quite a briefcase full of work already with a suit by Highland Oil for building permit rights in Lathrup, as well as a suit by the State Water Resources Commission demanding an end to pollution of the Rouge River.)

HAYES will study the letter which asks that Lathrup truck community incinerator instead of having a private contractor handle same, once a month, at a much lower cost to the city, according to Leonard Watchowski, city administrator.

"Most of the homes in Lathrup have garbage disposals," said Watchowski. "Therefore, use of an incinerator is not nearly as great as that of the other communities in the authority."
