**Hold S'fld Woman for Forgery**

Birmingham Police expect to arraign Mamie J. Smith, former Southfield township resident, tomorrow on charges in connection with forged checks reported to be in excess of \$20,000 by the firm Co. Telegaph road, Bloomfield township, where his son also has been employed.

Robert W. Elder, one of the firm's principals, sized the war can a week ago specifically charging Miss Smith with forging a \$100 check.

Det. Lt. Merlin Holmquist and Det. Robert Schauls were unable to locate her until late Tuesday and at that time they called in State police to arrest the woman at an address in Saugatuck where she had been living since the fund shortage was discovered, Schauls said.

Facts in the case, first printed by The Eclectic last July, indicate that forgeries were made and books destroyed to cover losses, according to company officials.

Miss Smith, formerly of 21342 Malone, a former employe of Southfield township for five years, came to Elder's about two years ago.

Discrepancies in the company's books appeared in July when the company changed from a partnership to a corporation. Further checking pointed out that checks cashed over a previous 18-month period, had been forged in the name of Robert Elder.

For the funeral services, Christ Church at 11 a.m. Monday, honorary pallbearers were William Walker, James R. Adams, Walter O. Briggs, Romeo di Marco, John MacManus, Charles Lewis, an artist from New York, Virgil Paetzer, an area artist, and Harry Klingler, former vice president of General Motors.
