"There are no really bad boys, they are just mixed up and blundered," said the youth, Larry Overholt. His talk's theme was "Forgetting It So Easy," and commended the listless women of the Starr home's Southern Oakland County auxiliary, that grown people should not forget their own part in official duties, church activities that would encourage and attract the youth of the community, teaching them to use religion every day and learn the value and finished speaking style shown by meaning in our everyday world.

He ended his talk with "The way to live with one another is by practicing the Golden Rule." Sharing the speaking duties for the meeting at the home of Mrs. John P. Denison, at Church and Goodhue in Bloomfield Hills, was the founder of the school, Floyd Starr.

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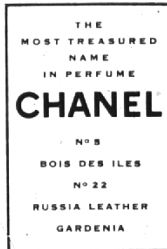
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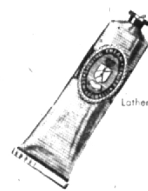

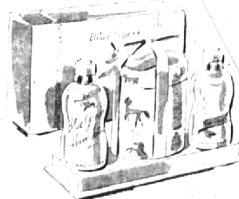
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
