Urge Careful Scrutiny Of Southfield Charter

The most important single civic question they ever will be called upon to decide, confronts the voters of Southfield township, when they cast their billiots De. 120 m whether or not to adopt the charter formilisted for them. If they approve this charter then the entire unincorporated area, comprising approximately 3.15 square miles of thinly-oppulated territory, will become a city, forever divorced from its present township status. It will be recalled that on June 7 the question of changing from township to city status was approved by the margin of 3,176 favorable and 2,111 opposing votes.

Much discussion also has taken place among Southfield township voters about the manner of acquiring a city clerk and treasurer.

In the case of the treasurer, he or she is the community's custodian of revenues; he or she is without policy-making privileges. A clerk, too, is without a council vote, although it or she does, in many cases, wield some "influence" in a manual's legislative processes.

Perhaps both these offices properly could be filled by the souncil, from a list of names suggested by the city manager; or the manager could make the appointment, subject to confirmation by the council—or some combination of both products no doubt would accomplish an acceptable solution to this question.

FOR. AFTER ALL, if a city manager is hired by a ority vote of a council, and the citzens are intelligently; their community's needs and solutions, then the plan osed in the current charter on this phase of the prol ay be worth a favorable vote bec. 12.
