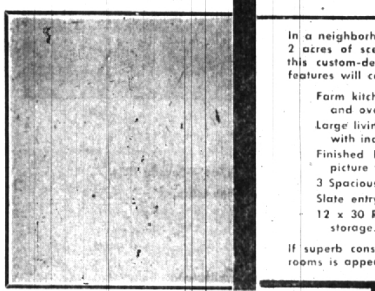
Family Gatherings Highlight News of Holiday Weekend
