

### Counties Move To Establish Highway Plan



A move to clear the way for future arterial highways in Oakland and five other southeastern Michigan counties got under way at a county supervisors' inter-county committee meeting.

The committee, meeting in Port Huron last Thursday, moved to establish a highway planning commission of representatives from Oakland, Wayne, Macomb, Washington, St. Clair and Monroe counties.

The commission will draft a map to highway plans, receive approval from local committees for routes within their boundaries, and recommend construction on approved routes.

Oakland county will be asked for its share, two years to complete \$2,000 toward the highway planning commission's establishment.
