### \$78,849 State Bonus Goes to School Teachers

Distribution of \$78,849 in state funds to Birmingham school district employees, was determined Tuesday night by the board of education, which also opened bids on the Derby junior high school swimming pool.

The amount from the state was on the basis of \$8 per pupil. Based on September enrollment figures of 9,721, the money went to 328 teachers in a \$200 raise and to 112 office and custodial employees in a \$150 raise.

**THESE RAISES** will not be included in next year's salary schedule, however, because there is no assurance from the state that the funds will be granted next year. School Supt. Dwight B. Ireland emphasized.

Raise granted totaled \$10,000 over the amount forthcoming from the state when will be absorbed by the district's general fund.
