For the past six years, Mrs. Earl Weston, Forman Drive, has directed Christmas plays at the Westminster Presbyterian church, Detroit.

This year's play features an angel choir which is elevated from the stage, behind a scrim curtain giving the effect or illusion that they are descending from heaven.

At the close of the play, the nativity scene is held while the annual candlelight service follows. In this service, three senior high people appear first, one with a very large candle which is the Christ candle. The other two take their lights from this larger one and they all the choir children, presenting candles, take their lights from the two.

The entire service is built around white gifts which are brought by everyone and then presented by the church to a community settlement house.

On Dec. 22, Mrs. Weston will entertain some 30 women, all members of Detroit Town Hall. They will come at 10:30 in the morning, dressed for snow play and will start the day doing just that. They will then take to the ice and enjoy skating. Mrs. Weston is hoping for sufficient snow that they can round up their snow activities on the Westons' own toboggan run which extends down the side of their property to Wing Lake.

During these outdoor activities, there will be champagne punch in the lower level activities room for them to enjoy at warm-up breaks. Following a lunch of fireplace braided burgers and hot coffee, they will spend the afternoon at bridge.
