First Southfield Win Doesn't Come Easy

Two streaks were at stake in the Southfield-Redford Union basketball game Tuesday night. Redford had won three straight games while the Jays had lost three in a row. Southfield snapped its streak by joining Redford, 55-51, for its first victory of the season. The Jays took the lead at the first quarter mark, 13-10, and increased the margin to 25-19 at the half. It looked like an easy victory for coach Bob Watt's squad with a 10-0 lead. But Redford's Redford Union was not quite through. Eight quick Redford points tied the score, 41-41, in the opening minutes of the fourth period. Baskets by the Jay's Bob Evans and Ron Hinkle of Redford knotted the score, 43-43. Redford jumped into a 48-45 lead with three minutes left in the game but Southfield settled down to go back into the lead, 55-51, with only a minute left to play. Southfield's prize guard combination led the scoring parade for the Jays. Ken Moses had 12 points and Evans was the game's high scorer with 20. Evans missed only one free throw in 11 attempts.


